GENERAL NOTES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS 2019

All exhibitors are responsible for ensuring they have the correct number of admission tickets, either purchased in advance, or at the gate on the day, as we operate a strict "no ticket, no entry" policy:

- All exhibitors will receive one free vehicle parking ticket. This MUST BE CLEARLY DISPLAYED TO ALLOW ENTRY OF THE **VEHICLE ONLY** TO THE DESIGNATED PARKING AREA ON THE FIELD - OCCUPANTS MUST HAVE THE CORRECT ADMISSION TICKET(S) as follows:-
- Exhibitors making entries valued £5 or over will receive one free admission ticket and can purchase additional reduced rate admission tickets in advance or purchase full price ticket(s) at the gate on the day:-
- Reduced rate: £8 each for adults; £5 each for 60 & over; or £4 each for 5 - 15 years old.
- Full price on the day: £10 each for adults; £6 each for 60 & over; or £5 each for 5 - 15 years old.
- Exhibitors making entries valued under £5 will need to purchase reduced rate admission tickets as above or pay full price on the day.
- All advance tickets can be ordered alongside your class entries on the printed or online Entry Form.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION TO THE SHOW SOCIETY

You, your family and friends may be interested in subscribing to the Society. Members can take advantage of forward car parking on the upper level (*subject to availability*); and use the private Hospitality Area with bar facilities, toilets and seating alongside the Main Ring. You can also take advantage of the three-course Official Luncheon (*bookable in advance at £25 per head*). There are 3 categories of Subscription:

SHOW RULES

1. All entries will be confirmed to the radius determined by the Society.
2. Entries will be accepted only on the distinct understanding that neither the Society nor any of its Officers can be held responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibit no matter how much loss or damage may arise.
3. The Society reserves the right to cancel any class for which an insufficient number of entries are received. Alternatively, such classes may be held with the prize money reduced at the discretion of the Committee.
4. All entries must be the sole bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at the time the entry is made.
5. All entries must be made on the form provided and should be accompanied by the full amount of the fees as indicated in the Schedule.
6. The Secretary, in making out the Award Book for the Judges, will strike out all entries for competition in which the entrance fees are not paid on the day of entries closing. This rule will be strictly enforced.
7. All exhibits must be in position on the ground not later than, nor removed no earlier than, the time stated in the respective Schedule.
8. The decision of the Judges shall in all cases be final, except (a) when a bona-fide mistake has been made by the Judges, in which case it will be competent for the Judges to review or reconsider their decision, or (b) where misrepresentation or breach of these Rules is discovered and proved to the satisfaction of the Committee whose decision shall be final.

9. Any objection against the award of prizes must be made in writing to the Secretary on the Show field. A deposit of £10 must accompany each objection, which deposit will be returned if the objection is proved, and if not, will be forfeited to the Society. The decision of the Society shall be final.
10. The Society will hold themselves responsible for the payment of prizes, except Special Prizes, which are only offered on behalf of the Donors who are solely responsible for them.
11. Winners of Challenge Cups and Trophies shall sign a receipt for same and undertake to return the Cup or Trophy when required by the Society.

HEALTH & SAFETY RESUME

- **Accidents:** All accidents must be reported to a steward or the Secretary at the Administration Tent.
- **Insurance:** Where applicable all exhibitors should have public liability insurance.
- All contractors and exhibitors will comply with their own trade/professional standards to meet the Health and Safety standards required by law.
- All livestock exhibitors are responsible for the safety and proper conduct of their animals, which must remain in their allotted area at all times
- There will be no junior handlers of livestock
- The Society's stewards have the right to box any animal perceived to be unruly.
- In accordance with the H &SE guidance notes GS36 "Safe custody of Bulls at Agricultural Shows"
 - All Bulls must have two handlers.
 - All Bulls over the age of 10 months to be ringed or led by bulldogs.
- The Society is required by law to adhere to the requirements laid out in this statement.
- The Society's full Health & Safety Policy statement is available to all exhibitors, (including livestock and Trade Stands) and members of the general public, at the Administration Tent.

Please note the following rules which are applicable to this section and are in addition to those listed above:-

- Please state on entry form if your sheep are MV accredited.
- Movement restrictions in place on the 7th September must be adhered to by all exhibitors. All livestock trailers and vehicles must be clean and remain within the livestock section until they return home. All exhibitors and handlers must ensure their clothing and footwear is clean before they leave the livestock area. Disinfectant will be provided in appropriate areas.
- All sheep must be registered with the Livestock Secretary before the start of the Show.
- All exhibitors are responsible for the safety of their animals which must remain in their allotted areas at all times.
- All sheep must be in their area by 10.00 am. Judging starts at 10.30 am.
- No animal to wear prize cards or rosettes during judging.
- All livestock must remain on the field until 4.30 pm.
- Prize Winners will be expected to parade.
