



INTRODUCTORY RITE

ENTRANCE HYMN - 604 - *Seek ye first the kingdom of God*

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON - *The love of God has been poured into our hearts by his Spirit living in us, Alleluia*

Fr. Guest: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
People: **Amen.**

Fr. Guest: The grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.
People: **And also with you.**

Fr. Guest: Let us pray that the Spirit will work through our lives to bring Christ into our world. Father, Let the Spirit you sent to begin the teaching of your Gospel continue to work in our world, through our hearts and the hearts of all who believe.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Fr. Guest: My brothers and sisters, to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries, let us call to mind our sins.

Fr. Guest: You were sent to heal the contrite:
Lord, have mercy.

People: **Lord, have mercy.**

Fr. Guest: You plead for us at the right hand of the Father:
Lord, have mercy.

People: **Lord, have mercy.**

Fr. Guest: May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

People: **Amen.**

Fr. Guest: God of power and mercy, send your Holy Spirit to live in our hearts and make us temples of his glory. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

People: **Amen**

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING (Ecclesiastes 2: 4-9)

A reading from the book of Ecclesiastes

Two are better off than one, because together they can work more effectively. If one of them falls down, the other can help him up. but if someone is alone and falls, it's just too bad, because there is no one to help him. If it is cold, two can sleep together and stay warm, but how can you keep warm by yourself? Two men can resist an attack that would defeat one man alone.

A rope made of three cords is hard to break.

This is the Word of the Lord.

People: **Thanks be to God.**

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

A reading from the letter of St John

This is how we know what love is: Christ gave his life for us.

My children, our love should not be just words or talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.

This is the Word of the Lord.

People: **Thanks be to God.**

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, Alleluia!

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia

GOSPEL (Matthew 5: 13-16)

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

“You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled under foot. You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.”

THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

Candidates stand

Fr. Guest: Do you believe in God, The Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth?

Candidates: **I do**

Fr. Guest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His Only Son, Our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the father?

Candidates: **I do**

Fr. Guest: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who came upon the apostles at Pentecost and today is given to you sacramentally in Confirmation?

Candidates: **I do**

Fr. Guest: Do you believe in the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting?

Candidates: **I do**

Fr. Guest: This is our faith, the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus, Our Lord.

All: **Amen**

Fr. Guest: My dear friends, in Baptism, God Our Father gave the new birth of eternal life to his chosen sons and daughters. Let us pray to the Father that he will pour out his Holy Spirit to strengthen his sons and daughters with his gifts and anoint them to be more like Christ the Son of God.

LAYING ON OF HANDS

The people stand and candidates kneel in their places.

Fr. Guest: All powerful God, Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit, you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send forth your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgement and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ Our Lord.

All: **Amen**

ANOINTING WITH CHRISM

Candidates & Sponsors come forward and stand before Fr. Guest.

Candidate gives name card to Canon Bowdren.

Sponsors put their right hand on candidates' right shoulder as they are presented.

Fr. Guest: be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Candidate: **Amen**

Fr. Guest: Peace be with you.

Candidate: **And also with you.**

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Fr. Guest: On this day of Confirmation, we pray that the Spirit of God, who has sealed our brothers and sisters forever, will guide us to seek the truth and hear the Word of God, so that we may be witnesses of Christ's presence in the world.

Reader: Prayer ending - **Spirit of God**

Response: **Come to us.**

Fr. Guest: Let us commend ourselves and all our prayers to Our Lady's intercession.

People: **HAIL, holy Queen, Mother of mercy.
Hail, our life, our sweetness, and our hope!
To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve;
To thee do we send up our sighs,
mourning and weeping in this vale of tears.
Turn then, most gracious advocate,
thine eyes of mercy toward us.
And after this our exile show unto us
the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus.
O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.**

Fr. Guest: Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

Response: **That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.**
