you feel able. Your responses will be analysed by the Parish Pastoral Council
who will produce a summary. All information will be kept confidential.

We hope that by listening to everyone, we can become a better Catholic
community, as Pope Francis wants.

1. Do you come to church at Ss John Fisher & Thomas More regularly?

Do you think this issue still needs to be acknowledged and addressed?

8. We have been twinned with St Anne's Buxton for about 18 months and our priest is no longer resident in the parish. How do you feel about this? Is it better or worse than you imagined?

9. The role of the deacon has become more prominent in our parish—
Do you welcome it? Could it be improved / better focused? If so how?

10. In the light of declining church attendance, is there a future for the parish?
How do you think this future will be different to the present?

11. How do you see the future of the presbytery?

12. Are there any ways that you would like Ss John Fisher & Thomas More to become more engaged with the parish and the community in the future?

13. People often say that the Catholic Church never listens to anyone. Please take this opportunity to tell us anything else that you would like to say to us.
